## Supply Chain Report: Comments AS OF MARC

AS OF MARCH 31, 2020

- Activity and shipments have decreased somewhat but if the virus persists past May 1st could see it becoming a 1.
- We are shifting product requests to vendors made in America or companies that have a good ability to deliver on time – but that is changing day to day and we anticipate that stock outs will be much more rampant by mid-April.
- Our industry may be needed critical and open for business, if we can't get into buildings to do the work it doesn't do a whole lot of good.
- Shipments from China running slow... cancelled flights result in reduced air freight capacity, driving up freight costs and stretching shipping schedules.
- Domestic vendors are open with skeleton work force. What was daily shipments from their facility are now being batched and shipped 1-2 days a week.
- Shipments up a little for now.
- Availability is generally good as we have not (yet) experienced any interruption in the supply chain. We are open for business as distribution is designated as critical infrastructure providers.
